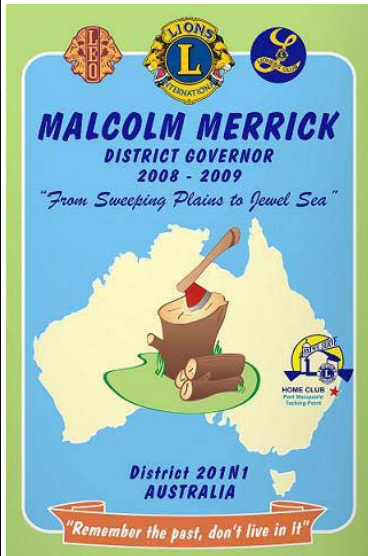

MEMBERSHIP

A strong active membership is the foundation of our association and its mission to serve communities around the world. As membership grows, so do resources necessary to maintain our numbers. Therefore our focus on membership growth needs to be continual - a 365 day a year activity. Growing Clubs have a strategy for membership development and follow a well thought out and organised action plan. The "Year Round Growth Program" (Downloadable from Australian Lions Website www.lionsclubs.org.au) provides tools, resources and strategies to aid members and clubs with their respective membership growth initiatives, awarding those who take the extra step and sponsor new members. Don't put off until tomorrow introducing this program into your Club. Remember that it is now 2008.

Travelling around our District over the past 12 months I saw newly reinvigorated clubs benefiting from family membership addition of more women and young people. Women's Membership is the fastest-growing part of our Lions Family. 2007-2008 membership reports show that we currently have 252,235 women members

worldwide which is a net gain of 14,757. This is almost 30,000 more hands that can help make a difference to our communities. These innovative programs and strategies are largely responsible for membership increases.

Membership Retention goes 'back to basics' - back to the reason we all became Lions. People will join our ranks because "We Serve" and will stay for this very reason. All Presidents and their Club executives need to take a managerial approach to Service. Our best, most effective clubs actively seek-out new service opportunities and experiment with new methods of meeting their communities most pressing needs. Not surprisingly clubs such as these are not only the most effective, their retention rates are also among the highest.

Loosing a member can have many repercussions. We hear former members say "I was in Lions but they did" 'this' or 'that' "and I left". How often does the 'that' or 'this' refer to those individuals not being involved in community service and when they leave our organisation they will obviously talk to other people who may also have been prospective members.

Diabetes is the fastest growing epidemic in human history , every 50 minutes an Australian becomes Diabetic = 27 people / day = over 100.000 / year ! 85 - 90 % of all cases are Type 2 Diabetics.

November 2008 is : DIABETES AWARENESS MONTH. November 14 is WORLD DIABETES DAY.

STRIDES WALK FOR DIABETES = this months "Low impact Walking activity with Community involvement."

In an effort to let you know more about our Cabinet members I have asked Bill Burges, District Treasurer for a run down. Thanks also to Ken Crampton for his submission, unfortunately its somewhere in cyber space

BILL BURGES

Born 1942 raised and educated in Newcastle Bill has tertiary qualifications in Metallurgy and Education. He worked as a Metallurgist in the Newcastle steel industry for seven years before taking up teaching at secondary level. Bill has taught Science at Newcastle Boys High, Courallie High School at Moree, Melville High School at Kempsey, Bourke High School, where he was Principal for two years and finally Quirindi High School where he was Deputy Principal until his retirement in 1999. He also lectured at TAFE to Diploma Students for 2 years. During his teaching career, Bill was an active member of the Royal Australian Air Force Reserve that he joined at University. He was commissioned on graduation in 1965 and completed his service as a Flight Lieutenant when he moved to Bourke. He holds the Australian Cadet Forces Medal with one bar and the Australian Defence Medal. Bill was also active as an examiner of the Royal Life Saving Society spending over 20 years as a Senior Examiner (Level 3). He has been a Justice of the Peace for the State of New South Wales since 1972, Secretary of Harrington Crowdy Head RSL Sub-Branch and Senior Vice President of Taree Legacy Club Inc.

Bill was invited to join the Lions Club of Moree in 1977 by Lion Bert Carroll. He transferred to Kempsey, Bourke, Quirindi and Harrington Lions Clubs as his work moved him about the State. At Club level Lion Bill has been a Director and Bulletin Editor (Moree), Secretary (Kempsey), Secretary and Vice President (Bourke), Secretary (15 terms), Treasurer(2), Tail Twister, Secretary (3rd term) (Harrington) and President (2 terms) (Quirindi). He is presently a member of Harrington Club where he is entering his fourth term as Secretary having served one year as Tail Twister.

Lion Bill was invited to join 201N4 District Cabinet by PDG Max Cosier where he was Zone Chairman and Deputy District Governor (2 terms). On returning to 201N1 he was appointed to District Cabinet as Zone Chairman (2 terms) and has been a District Chairman (many terms) and Cabinet Secretary (3 terms). At the Kempsey Convention, Lion Bill was elected Lieutenant Governor (1993 -94) but due to changes to the International Constitution, Lion Bill became this District's first Vice District Governor. Bill Served as Vice District Governor 1998 - 1999 and District Governor 1999 - 2000. He is currently serving his first term as Cabinet Treasurer.

At Club Level, Lion Bill has been awarded many President Appreciation Awards and at least 21 100% Secretary Awards as well as two Treasurer's Awards. At District Level he has three Zone Chairman, Deputy District Governor and many District Chairman Awards as well as two District Governor Appreciation Awards and three Star Awards. District 201N1 also nominated Lion Bill as a Life Member of the NSW ACT Save Sight Foundation. At International Level Lion Bill is a 100% President, Key Member and holds a Membership Achievement Award. Quirindi Club made him a Melvin Jones Fellow in 1993 and a Life Member in 2003. The Lions District made Bill a William R Tresise Fellow in 2000.

Lion Bill has attended every District Convention since his return from 201N4 in 1988 having attended three in that District and three in N1 before transferring to Bourke. He has also attended 16 Multiple District Conventions and five International Conventions.

Lion Bill has completed Leadership Skills, Train the Trainer and the Advanced Trainer Certificate awarded by Multiple District 201. He also completed Certified Guiding Lion Training at the Hong Kong International Convention. He served as a member of the MD201 Leadership Development Subcommittee for three years prior to his election as District Governor.

Bill loves fishing and lawn bowls. He says he doesn't get enough of the former due to commitments with Lions and Bowls. In Lawn Bowls he is a National Bowls Umpire (Level 2) and is currently Chairman of Umpires in the Manning District Bowling Association. He also trains and assesses new umpires and reaccredits local umpires every four years for the Royal New South Wales Bowling Association's Umpire Panel.

Bill is a member of a small family. Both his father and mother are deceased. His brother Stephen lives with his wife Sylvia in Seattle in the United States where he is Professor of Civil and Environmental Engineering in the University of Washington.

CHILDRENS CANCER RESEARCH

After accidents, cancer is the common cause of death of children in Australia. 500 children are diagnosed each year and the best news is that 7 out of 10 will survive. Research is committed to improving this survival rate even further.

Lions so far have donated \$3.5 million to the Childrens Cancer Institute of Aust over the last nine years.
